If a party or party's witness does not proficiently speak or understand the English language and before commencement of the hearing requests language assistance, an agency subject to the language assistance requirement in section 11435.15 of the Government Code shall provide a certified interpreter or an interpreter approved by the administrative law judge conducting the proceedings. The cost of providing the interpreter shall be paid by the agency having jurisdiction over the matter if the administrative law judge or hearing officer so directs, otherwise by the party for whom the interpreter is provided. If you or a witness requires the assistance of an interpreter, ample advance notice of this fact should be given to the Office of Administrative Hearings so that appropriate arrangements can be made.

3. On or about March 18, 1985, the Board issued Veterinarian License No. 8855 to Respondent. The Veterinarian License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 4602020000383, and will expire on December 31, 2021, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

- 4. Accusation No. 4602020000383 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on January 19, 2021. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation.
- A copy of Accusation No. 4602020000383 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 6. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 4602020000383. Respondent has also carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order.
- 7. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 8. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

 Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 4602020000383.

10. Respondent agrees that his Veterinarian License is subject to discipline and he agrees to be bound by the Board's probationary terms as set forth in the Disciplinary Order below.

CONTINGENCY

- 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Veterinary Medical Board. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Veterinary Medical Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 13. This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
- 14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Disciplinary Order:

DISCIPLINARY ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Veterinarian License No. 8855 issued to Respondent Won Peter Seung is revoked. However, the revocation is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation

for five (5) years on the following terms and conditions:

1. Obey All Laws.

Respondent shall obey all federal and state laws and regulations substantially related to the practice of veterinary medicine. Within thirty (30) days of any arrest, Respondent shall notify the Board. Within thirty (30) days of any conviction., Respondent shall report to the Board and provide proof of compliance with the terms and conditions of the court order including, but not limited to, probation and restitution requirements.

2. Quarterly Reports and Interviews

Respondent shall report quarterly to the Board or its designee, under penalty of perjury, on forms provided by the Board, stating whether there has been compliance with all terms and conditions of probation. Omission or falsification in any manner of any information on these reports shall constitute a violation of probation and shall result in the filing of an accusation and/or a petition to revoke probation against Respondent's license, registration or permit. If the final written quarterly report is not made as directed, the period of probation shall be extended until the final report is received by the Board. Any period(s) of delinquency in submission of reports as directed may be added to the total period of probation.

3. Interview with the Board

Within 30 days of the effective date of the Decision, Respondent shall appear in person for an interview with the Board or its designee to review the terms and conditions of probation.

Thereafter, Respondent shall, upon reasonable request, report or appear in person as directed.

4. Cooperation with Board Staff

Respondent shall cooperate with the Board's inspection program and with the Board's monitoring and investigation of Respondent's compliance with the terms and conditions of his or her probation. Respondent may receive the assistance of private counsel, but Respondent shall communicate directly with the Board or its designee, and written communications from the Board will only be sent to the Respondent. Respondent shall make available all patient records, hospital records, books, logs, and other documents relating to the practice of veterinary medicine to the Board, upon request.

Respondent shall claim all certified mail issued by the Board, respond in a timely manner to all notices and requests for information, and submit Reports, Identification Update reports or other reports similar in nature, as requested and directed by the Board or its designee. Respondent is encouraged to contact the Board's probation monitoring program representative at any time he/she has a question or concern regarding his or her terms and conditions of probation.

5. Probation Monitoring Costs

Probation monitoring costs are set at a rate of \$100 per month for the duration of the probation. These costs shall be payable to the Board on a schedule as directed by the Board or its designee.

6. Changes of Employment or Address

Respondent shall notify the Board, and appointed probation monitor in writing, of any and all changes of employment, location, and address within fourteen (14) calendar days of such change. This includes, but is not limited to, termination or resignation from employment, change in employment status, and change in supervisors, administrators or directors. Respondent shall also notify his or her probation monitor AND the Board IN WRITING of any changes of residence or mailing address within fourteen (14) calendar days. P.O. Boxes are accepted for mailing purposes; however, Respondent must also provide his or her physical residence address as well.

- No Supervision of Students, Interns, or Residents
 Respondent shall not supervise students, interns, or residents.
- 8. Notice to Employers

During the period of probation, Respondent shall notify all present and prospective employers of this Decision and the terms, conditions, and restrictions imposed on Respondent by Decision, as follows:

Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Decision and within fifteen (15) days of Respondent undertaking any new employment, Respondent shall cause his or her supervisor and/or managing licensee (licensee manager) to report to the Board in writing, acknowledging that the listed individual(s) has/have read Decision, including the terms, conditions, and

restrictions imposed. It shall be Respondent's responsibility to ensure that his or her supervisor and/or licensee manager submit timely acknowledgment(s) to the Board.

Relief veterinarians shall notify employers immediately and require the supervisor and/or licensee manager to submit timely acknowledgement.

9. Notice to Employees

Throughout the probationary period, and in a manner that is visible to all licensed, registered, or permitted veterinary employees at the veterinary premises, Respondent shall post a notice, provided or approved by the Board, that recites the violations for which Respondent has been disciplined and the terms and conditions of probation.

10. Tolling of Probation

Respondent shall notify the Board or its designee in writing within fifteen (15) calendar days of any periods of non-practice lasting more than thirty (30) calendar days and shall notify the Board or its designee within fifteen (15) calendar days of Respondent's return to practice.

Any period of non-practice will result in the Respondent's probation being tolled.

Non-practice is defined as any period of time exceeding thirty (30) calendar days in which Respondent is not engaging in the practice of veterinary medicine in California. While tolled for residing/practicing outside of California, Respondent must comply with the following terms and conditions of probation: obey all laws, quarterly reports, interview with the Board, tolling of probation, maintain a current and active California license or registration, and cost recovery.

Non-practice is also defined as any period that Respondent fails to engage in the practice of veterinary medicine in California for a minimum of 24 hours per week for the duration of probation (except reasonable time away from work for vacations, illnesses, etc.) or as determined by the Board. While tolled for not meeting the hourly requirement, Respondent shall comply with all terms and conditions of this Decision.

Any period of tolling will not apply to the reduction of the probationary term.

11. Maintain a Valid License

At all times while on probation, Respondent shall maintain a current and active license with the Board, including any period during which suspension or probation is tolled. If Respondent's license, by operation of law or otherwise, expires, upon renewal, Respondent's license shall be subject to any and all terms of this probation not previously satisfied.

12. Violation of Probation

If Respondent violates probation in any respect, the Board, after giving Respondent notice and the opportunity to be heard, may revoke probation and carry out the disciplinary order that was stayed. If an accusation or petition to revoke probation is filed against Respondent during probation, or if the Attorney General's office has been requested to prepare any disciplinary action against Respondent's license, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final, and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final. No petition for modification or termination of probation shall be considered while there is an accusation or petition to revoke probation pending against Respondent.

13. License Surrender While on Probation/Suspension

Following the effective date of this Decision, should Respondent cease to practice veterinary medicine due to retirement or health issues, or be otherwise unable to satisfy the terms and conditions of probation, Respondent may tender his or her license to practice veterinary medicine to the Board for surrender. The Board or its designee has the discretion to grant the request for surrender or to take any other action it deems appropriate and reasonable. Upon formal acceptance of the license surrender, Respondent will no longer be subject to the terms and conditions of probation. The surrender constitutes a record of discipline and shall become a part of the Respondent's license history with the Board.

Respondent must relinquish his or her license to the Board within ten (10) days of receiving notification from the Board that the surrender has been accepted.

14. Completion of Probation

All costs for probation monitoring and/or mandatory premises inspections shall be borne by Respondent. Failure to pay all costs due shall result in an extension of probation until the matter is resolved and costs paid or a petition to revoke probation is filed. Upon successful completion of probation and all payment of fees due, Respondent's license will be fully restored.

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15. Cost Recovery 1 2 Pursuant to Section 125.3 of the California Business and Professions Code, within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Decision, Respondent shall pay to the Board its enforcement 3 costs including investigation, and prosecution, in the amount of \$1,765 in a Board-approved 4 5 payment plan, within six (6) months before the end of the probation term. Cost recovery will not be tolled. 6 16. Submit to Drug Testing 7 Respondent shall immediately submit to drug testing, at Respondent's cost, upon request by 8 9 the Board or its designee. 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JURISDICTION

 This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

- 4. Section 118, subdivision (b) provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a license shall not deprive a board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated. Under Business and Professions Code section 4843.5, the Board may renew an expired license at any time within five years after the expiration.
- 5. Section 490 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that a board may suspend or revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the license was issued.
- 6. Section 4875 provides, in pertinent part, that The Board of Veterinary Medicine may revoke or suspend the license of any person to practice veterinary medicine, or any branch thereof, in this state for any causes provided in the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4800, et seq.). In addition, the Board has the authority to assess a fine not in excess of \$5,000 against a licensee for any of the causes specified in section 4883 of that code. Such fine may be assessed in lieu of, or in addition to, a suspension or revocation.
 - 7. Section 4883 states, in pertinent part:

The board may deny, revoke, or suspend a license or assess a fine as provided in Section 4875 for any of the following:

- (a) Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of veterinary medicine, surgery, or dentistry, in which case the record of the conviction shall be conclusive evidence.
 -
 - (g) Unprofessional conduct, that includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 -
- (2) (A) The use of or prescribing for or administering to himself or herself, any controlled substance.

(B) The use of any of the dangerous drugs specified in Section 4022, or of alcoholic beverages to the extent, or in any manner as to be dangerous or injurious to a person licensed under this chapter [the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act], or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person so licensed to conduct with safety the practice authorized by the license.

(C) The conviction of more than one misdemeanor or any felony involving the use, consumption or self-administration of any of the substances referred to in this section or any combination thereof and the record of the conviction is conclusive evidence.

A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this section. The board may order the license suspended or revoked or assess a fine, or may decline to issue a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the person to withdraw his or her plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information, or indictment.

8. Section 4885 states, in pertinent part:

A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere made to a charge of a felony or of any offense related to the practice of veterinary medicine or the practice of a veterinary technician is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this article. The board may order the license or registration to be suspended or revoked, or assess a fine as provided in Section 4883 or may decline to issue a license or registration, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4, 1210.1, or 3063.1 of the Penal Code allowing that person to withdraw his or her plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information, or indictment.

REGULATORY PROVISIONS

9. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2040, states:

"For the purposes of denial, suspension, or revocation of a license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475), a crime or act shall be considered to be substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a person holding a license under Chapter 11 of Division 2 if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a person holding a license to perform the functions authorized by his or her license in a manner consistent with the public health, safety or welfare."

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COST RECOVERY

10. Section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Conviction of Substantially Related Crime)

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 490, 4883, subdivision (a), 11. and 4885, in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2040, in that Respondent was convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a veterinarian, as follows: On or about October 8, 2019, after pleading guilty, Respondent was convicted of one felony count of violating Vehicle Code section 20001, subdivision (a)/(b)(2) [hit and run with permanent injury or death], one misdemeanor count of violating Vehicle Code section 23152, subdivision (a) [driving under the influence of alcohol], and one misdemeanor count of violating Vehicle Code section 23152, subdivision (b) [driving while having 0.08% or more, by weight, of alcohol in his blood in the criminal proceeding entitled The People of the State of California v. Won Pyo Seung (Super. Ct. Orange County, 2019, No. 19NF2012). The court sentenced Respondent to serve 364 days in jail, ordered him to complete a 3-month first offender DUI program, and placed him on 5 years' formal probation, with terms and conditions. The circumstances surrounding the conviction are that on or about November 12, 2018, Respondent was involved in a fatal traffic collision for which he failed to stop. Responding officers found bumper remains of another vehicle with an attached license plate and located the vehicle parked in front of Respondent's residence. While speaking to Respondent, the officers could smell the strong odor of alcohol emitting from his breath and he was observed to have bloodshot, watery eyes. When asked, Respondent admitted to driving the vehicle and being involved in an accident. During the booking procedure, more than four hours after the accident, Respondent submitted to a breath test that revealed a breath alcohol content level of 0.064 % on the first reading and 0.066% on the second reading.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 1 (Dangerous Use of Alcohol) 2 12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4883, subdivisions 3 (g)(2)(B), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that on or about November 12, 2018, 4 5 Respondent used alcoholic beverages to an extent or in a manner dangerous or injurious to himself, to any person, or to the public. Complainant refers to and by this reference incorporates, 6 the allegations set forth above in paragraph 11, as though set forth fully. 7 THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 8 (Felony Conviction Involving the Consumption of Alcohol) 9 13. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4883, subdivisions 10 (g)(2)(C), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent sustained a felony 11 conviction involving the consumption of alcohol. Complainant refers to and by this reference 12 incorporates, the allegations set forth above in paragraph 11, as though set forth fully. 13 14 PRAYER WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, 15 and that following the hearing, the Veterinary Medical Board issue a decision: 16 1. Revoking or suspending Veterinarian License Number 8855, issued to Won Peter 17 Seung; 18 2. Ordering Won Peter Seung to pay the Veterinary Medical Board the reasonable costs 19 of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Veterinary Medicine; and, 20 3. I write in regards to my client Won Seung. Please copy me on all correspondence between Dr. Seung and the California Veterinary Medical Board in this matter. Dr. Seung is in receipt of your letter dated June 13, 2022. Dr. Seung has authored a response to the violation letter. In his response, Dr. Seung admits that on June 6, 2022, he tested positive for the presence of alcohol. Dr. Seung further admits in his response that he was aware that Condition 18 of his Final Decision & Order required Dr. Seung to abstain from all consumption of alcohol.

Dr. Seung fully acknowledges his misconduct that occurred on June 5, 2022, in which he consumed one can of beer after an extensive hike. This June 5, 2022 consumption of one can of beer resulted in Dr. Seung's June 6, 2022 positive test for the presence of alcohol. Dr. Seung had been sober since the date of his arrest on November 13, 2018. Over three and a half years later, in a moment of lapsed judgment, Dr. Seung consumed one old can of beer that he discovered in the back of his refrigerator and then subsequently tested positive for the presence of alcohol under the California Veterinary Medical Board's strict biological fluid testing program.

Dr. Seung is extremely remorseful for this misconduct. Dr. Seung readily admits that he should not have consumed that one can of beer. While Dr. Seung should not have

consumed one can of beer, it is important to note that Dr. Seung is not an alcoholic or addicted to alcohol. Dr. Seung did not consume copious amounts of alcohol on June 5, 2022, or consume any alcohol subsequent to June 5, 2022. This was a one time mistake, for which Dr. Seung has acknowledged his misconduct and expressed his remorse.

Dr. Seung is in the twilight of his career as a Veterinarian. Dr. Seung has been in practice for over thirty seven years. While Dr. Seung intended to significantly slow down his practice of Veterinary Medicine during the COVID-19 pandemic, Dr. Seung continues to practice Veterinary Medicine. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Dr. Seung avoided the use of alcohol spray and mouthwash to avoid a positive test for alcohol. Even after utilizing hand sanitizer, Dr. Seung would avoid touching his mouth. Dr. Seung desires to avoid a disappointing end to his career as a Veterinarian. Dr. Seung intends to complete the full term of his probation with the California Veterinary Medical Board.

Dr. Seung desires to avoid a Cease Practice Order and Petition to Revoke Probation.

Dr. Seung will remain compliant with all terms and conditions of his probation. Thank you for your consideration.

I confirm receipt of your letter dated June 13, 2022. In that letter, I was informed that on June 6, 2022, I tested positive for Ethylglucuronide (EtG) and Ethylsulfate (EtS) alcohol. I am also aware that Condition 18 of the Disciplinary Order from the Veterinary Medical Board requires me to completely abstain from the use of alcoholic beverages.

I would like to begin by admitting my violation. I admit that I consumed an alcoholic beverage. On June 5, 2022, I completed an extensive hike alone near my home as part of an ongoing fitness regimen. After completing the extensive hike, I looked for something to drink in my refrigerator and there was an old beer in the back of my refrigerator. Thus, I consumed one can of beer to celebrate my accomplishment of completing this hike. During the entirety of the COVID-19 pandemic, I refrained from using alcohol spray and mouthwash, which were common items used for sanitizing. Even after using hand sanitizer, I avoided touching my mouth to prevent a positive test for alcohol.

While consuming the beer, I did not think of the negative consequences to my Veterinarian License. After consuming the beer, I immediately regretted it. I have been on probation with the California Veterinary Medical Board for approximately one year. This was an enormous mistake, for which I take full responsibility and express my complete remorse. Petition for Early Termination/Modification

Dear Members of the Veterinary Medical Board:

I am petitioning the Department to grant me an early termination of probation. The following is a candid explanation for why I believe this request should be considered by the Board. I would be grateful for the board's time and consideration in reviewing my request.

I. Introduction

My License was placed on probation on July 29, 2021, in connection with a disciplinary action and/or investigation per Veterinary Medical Board Case No. 460202000383. I was convicted of violating California *Vehicle Code* § 20001(a)(b)(2), Hit and Run with Permanent and Serious Injury, and California *Vehicle Code* §§ 23152(a) and (b), Driving under the Influence of Alcohol, and Driving with a Blood Alcohol Content of 0.08% or greater.

Said charges are substantially related to the practice of veterinary medicine and use of alcohol in a manner that is dangerous or injurious to a person (BPC § 490(a)). My convictions under said charges therefore constitute cause under BPC § 4883(c) and g(2)(B)(C) for the restriction of my license and license rights under the Veterinary License Law.

a. Background Information

I spent my formative years in South Korea and moved to the United States in 1982. I have been working in the veterinary industry for over 46 years. In 1977, I graduated from Seoul University and started my career as a veterinarian for the Korea Army at Veterinary Hospital. I served in the army as a lieutenant officer until 1979.

From 1979 to 1982, with the objective of further enhancing my career and knowledge in the field, I pursued and completed my master's degree in internal medicine veterinary science at Seoul National University.

From 1982 to 1985, I further studied and successfully completed my master's degree in Pathology at UC Davis. In March of 1985, the Board issued me a veterinarian license. Thereafter, for three years, I worked for West Covina Veterinary Hospital for three years.

In 1988, I started my own practice and opened a veterinary clinic called "Animaid Pet Hospital," which was sold in the early part of 2019.

From February 2020 to present, I work as a part-time veterinarian at Gentle Care Pet Clinic.

b. The Incident (November 12, 2018)

On the evening of November 12, 2018, I attended a social meeting in La Mirada. At the said social meeting, I consumed approximately three cans of beer. At around 9:15 PM, I decided to leave the social gathering and head home. At approximately 9:30 PM, I was travelling on my way home, within the vicinity of Gilbert Street and Open Sky Drive in the City of Fullerton, when a collision took place between my vehicle and another vehicle, ultimately resulting in the other driver's death. Panicked, disoriented, terrified, and against my better judgment, I drove away from the scene of the accident, and did not stop. This is a decision that I have come to regret every single day of my life.

Shortly after I left the scene of the accident, the Fullerton Police officers located my vehicle at my residence. While the police officers were examining my vehicle, I voluntarily walked outside of my house and I admitted to them that I was the one driving my vehicle and that I was involved in the accident.

I likewise admitted to the Fullerton Police Officers that I consumed three cans of beer (12 oz.) between approximately 6:00 PM and 9:00 PM. I failed a series of Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. I was then transported to the Fullerton Police Department where I consented to a Breathalyzer. Said test resulted to 0.06% Blood Alcohol Content.

On July 29, 2019, the Orange County District Attorney's Office filed a Complaint before the Superior Court of California, County of Orange – case number 19NF2012. Said complaint alleged one count of Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, a misdemeanor, in violation of California Vehicle Code § 23152(a); one count of Driving with a Blood Alcohol Content of 0.08% or greater, a misdemeanor in violation of California Vehicle Code § 23152(b); and one count of California Vehicle 20001(a)(b)(2), a felony.

On October 10, 2019, in the Superior Court of California, County of Orange, in case number 19NF2012, I pled guilty to all of the above charges. I was sentenced to 5 years of

probation, 364 days in county jail, completion of a 3 month First Offender DUI Alcohol Program, completion of Victim Impact Counseling, payment of any restitution, standard terms and conditions of formal probation and payment of court fines, fees and costs. My Blood Alcohol Content was 0.06%.

II. Journey to Recovery and Rehabilitation

Since the incident, I have completed all the terms and conditions of my probation in the criminal case. I have taken proactive measures to address the underlying issues that contributed to my poor decision-making. I have also taken this opportunity to make significant changes in my lifestyle.

Since December of 2019, I have been participating in various alcohol monitoring programs such as the Orange County SEC monitoring, DUI classes, AA meetings, outpatient program for alcohol and drug monitoring, and Veterinary board required FS system monitor. I have completely abstained from alcohol since the incident and will continue to do so to ensure that similar incidents will never happen again.

I am currently working as a part-time veterinarian to help my family. I provide support to my family and make sure to contribute to the veterinary field despite the restrictions imposed on my license. I am continually planning to fulfil my vow of having an honorable retirement as a veterinarian.

I want to assure you that what happened was an isolated incident. I acknowledge the gravity of my wrongdoing; I should not have driven a vehicle subsequent to consuming alcohol. Furthermore, I should not have left the scene of the scene of an accident. These two grave errors in judgment resulted in fatal harm to another human being. The loss of life and its impact on the deceased's loved ones have haunted me, and not a single day goes by without my feeling remorse for my part in this horrible tragedy. I am committed to learning from my mistakes and becoming an improved and more conscientious individual. I am deeply remorseful for my actions and their consequences and I take full responsibility for my lapse in judgment.

Additionally, I have repaired many relationships such as with family and friends. I made amends to the best of my ability to the people I harmed. I have remained active in different recovery programs and have done service work to further my goals of helping not just myself but also other people.

I am seventy years old with diabetes mellitus and chronic pancreatitis. I have a 92-year old sick mother who is domiciled in South Korea. I hope to be granted an opportunity to visit my mother, given both of our health conditions. I request that the random alcohol test be waived and the probation period be shortened so I can do said visits without any restrictions. I am confident that I can continue to maintain my sobriety and accordingly provide safe and competent veterinary care

Conclusion

In light of the foregoing, I humbly request that the Board grant me the early termination of my license probation. The attached character reference letters, certificates of continuing

education, and rehabilitation completion certificates are offered as proof of my rehabilitation. I offer no excuse for my past conduct and actions; I openheartedly accept the responsibilities and consequences brought by my grave lapse of judgment.

I am now a responsible and productive member of society who has been rehabilitated. Since my conviction, I have never been criminally charged of any offense. I am no longer on criminal probation. Moreover, I do not pose any danger to the public.

I look forward to returning full-time to the occupation that I love and passionate about. I will never do anything to risk this opportunity again.


