Examination Updates

International Council for Veterinary Assessment (ICVA)

The ICVA administers the North American Veterinary Licensing Examination (NAVLE). ICVA's mission is to provide world-class examinations and other assessment tools to protect the public, and animal health and welfare.

Since the last Board meeting, ICVA has disseminated the following announcements:

NAVLE Practice Analysis Subject Matter Expert Recruitment Survey **– August 28, 2025.**

ICVA is currently seeking Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) to complete a recruitment survey to assist with finding SMEs for the NAVLE Practice Analysis. ICVA will need a wide range of experience to complete the panels at upcoming sessions, so interested veterinarians from all aspects of the profession are encouraged to participate in the survey.

Assessment Development Committee Nominations are Open – July 31, 2025

The ICVA has sent out a call for nominations for one (1) open position on the Assessment Development Committee (ADC). Nominees should have knowledge and experience with bovine-beef in the context of private clinical practice and/or practice of veterinary medicine at accredited veterinary schools.

Changes to the 2025–2026 ICVA Board – July 18, 2025

At June's Board Meeting, ICVA elected a new Executive Committee and welcomed four new members to the Board of Directors.

American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB)

The AAVSB administers the Veterinary Technician National Examination (VTNE). The AAVSB's mission is to support and advance the regulation of veterinary medicine.

JAVMA Article – Informed Consent by Chief Veterinary Officer, Dr. Beth Venit – September 2, 2025

In the September 2025 issue of the Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association (JAVMA), Dr. Beth Venit shares her thoughts on Informed Consent. "Obtaining and documenting informed consent for recommendations that are at or above the minimum standard of care is critical to practicing along a spectrum of care within the regulatory board's requirements."

Many veterinarians worry that diverting from gold standard medicine will put their license at risk. In the latest issue of JAVMA, our Chief Veterinary Officer, Beth Venit, dispels that myth. She also offers guidance to provide a range of responsible options to animal owners within the context of their situation.

The Veterinary Technician National Examination® Celebrating Diversity Award is presented to one graduating veterinary technology/nursing minority student who has been traditionally underrepresented in the veterinary technician profession. The award recipient is selected based on their commitment to fostering, cultivating, and preserving a culture of diversity, equity, and inclusion, as well as treating everyone with respect and dignity.

Latest Recipients of 2025 VTNE Program Director's Award – May 19, 2025

Overland Park, KS (April 25, 2025) – The American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB) announces the latest recipients of the 2025 Veterinary Technician National Examination® Program Director's Award. The faculty of the American Veterinary Medical Association Committee on Veterinary Education and Activities (AVMA-CVTEA) and Canadian Veterinary Medical Association (CVMA) accredited veterinary technology/nursing programs present this award.

Every year, one graduating student receives the award, which covers the cost of the VTNE exam. Each AVMA-CVTEA and CVMA accredited veterinary technology/nursing program receives a VTNE voucher to give to the student of their choice.

To date, 49 candidates have received vouchers and will be able to apply for the VTNE at no cost. Be on the lookout for more winners to be announced later this year.

Licensing Updates

Application Processing Time Webpage Update

In October 2025, the Board worked with the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) Office of Information Services to update its [Application Processing Time](#) webpage. The new design uses the same format and table as DCA's [Licensing Performance Measures](#) webpage.

The Board's updated Application Processing Time webpage provides an overview of initial application and renewal processing times and only includes licenses issued by the Board. The webpage will be updated directly with data from BreEZe.

Board Applications Received

The Board received a total of 887 license applications across all license types in Q1 Fiscal Year (FY) 25/26. The most significant decline was 222 less applications received for veterinary assistant controlled substance permits (VACSP).

Overall, the number of applications received through Q1 FY 25/26 decreased by approximately 281 comparing to Q1 FY 24/25.

Licenses, Registrations, and Permits Issued

The Board issued 924 licenses, registrations, and permits in Q1 FY 25/26. The total represents a slight decrease compared to 1,024 issued in Q1 FY 24/25.

Despite a decline of licenses, registrations, and permits issued overall, the Board issued more veterinarian licenses in Q1 FY 25/26 (225) than it has in Q1 of the past three fiscal years. Similar to applications received, the most significant decline in licenses, registrations, and permits issued was VACSPs, with approximately 101 less issued than in Q1 FY 24/25.

Applications Pending

The Board's pending applications at the conclusion of Q1 FY 25/26 across all license types was 475. That represents a decrease in pending applications by approximately 18% comparing to the number of pending applications at the end of Q1 FY 24/25, which was 570.

License Population

The Board's total license population increased to 48,363 during Q1 FY 25/26 compared to 48,055 at the conclusion of FY 24/25.
