What is ECFVG?

Overview

- Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates
 - Assessment-based Certificate Program
 - Key is to ensure that candidates meet the same day-one competencies of COE accredited colleges's graduates
 - One route for graduates of non-COE accredited veterinary colleges to gain licensure in U.S.
 - Accepted by all U.S. state veterinary regulatory boards and U.S. federal government
 - Meeting, in part or full, educational prerequisites for certain types of veterinary employment
 - ECFVG certificate holders must also pass NAVLE and any state specific examinations to become licensed

Steps in ECFVG Program

- Step 1: Registration and Proof of Graduation
 - Candidates must be a graduate from an AVMA ECFVG-listed school with a degree to practice veterinary medicine without restriction in their country
 - If school is not listed, they must follow the review process to have their school listed with ECFVG
- Step 2: English Language Ability
 - Three approve testing vendors to provide proof of comprehension and ability to communicate in English language
- Step 3: Basic and Clinical Sciences Knowledge
 - 225- multiple choice exam; taken at Prometric testing facility
 - Reviewed each year by Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) and a Psychometrician
- Step 4: Clinical Skills Assessment
 - 3-day, In-person clinical exam, 7 sections assessed
 - Small Animal Medicine
 - Equine Medicine
 - Food Animal Production
 - Radiographic Positioning
 - Necropsy
 - Anesthesia
 - Surgery



ECFVG by the Numbers

- Number applicants
 - Consistent growth since 2020
 - Currently over 600 new applicants per year
- Number certificates
 - On average 220 certificates issued per year
- Highest Countries receiving certificate
 - India
 - Egypt
 - Brazil



ECFVG Updates

- Staff Updates
 - ECFVG Program Manager
 - New Role ECFVG Systems Operations Administrator
- New Certificate management platform
 - Launching this fall
 - Candidate-focused portal
 - Updated interface with clear dashboard to show progress through the program
 - Easier communication options
- Additional Clinical Proficiency Exam (CPE, Step 4) testing dates in 2026
 - Currently 2 CPE testing sites in United States
 - Often rate-limiting step
- Review of CPF
 - Working with Psychometricians and Subject Matter Experts
 - Specific guiding point is that the exam rigor will not be changed (not lowered)
 - What might be moved to technology-based performance exam
 - What needs to remain clinical-based performance exam
 - Multi-year project
